Road Report, Fall 2015

While we are thankful for the wet winter and spring, the continual runoff is hard on the mountain roads in Idlewild. In August Skip Johnson, Frank Dodge, and I drove all the roads in Idlewild with contractor Johnny Johnson of Angel Fire. We made an assessment of the conditions and outlined a plan to improve the roads and the path of water runoff. The plan included grading and/or adding road material that Idlewild had already purchased and that had been placed in several locations in Idlewild. Mr. *Continued on page 4*

Johnson completed the repairs in August. In addition, Frank Dodge checks the roads and optimizes runoff conditions throughout the year. The Idlewild roads were in pretty good shape for mountain roads at the end of summer.

The good news is that we have enough budgeted funds to repeat this process after the spring thaw. See you on the mountain next spring.

Forest Health and Safety

"Frank Ray, Forest Health and Safety Chair"

President Maxi Millican and Frank Rav attended the August 20 meeting of the Colfax County Coalition of Firewise Communities (CCCFC) in Cimarron. The CCCFC now has approximately 70 members, including now the Idlewild Community Center. Maxi presented a status report of Idlewild's Firewise activity. We received news from the Ute Park NM Forestry Station of a growing

positive relationship with Taos Pueblo regarding our respective concerns regarding fires crossing the Taos/ Idlewild boundary, and got information regarding "shaded fuel breaks" from Joe Stehling, of Hidden Lake.



Digital Idlewild

At the 2015 Annual Meeting, Paul Fahrenthold restated the IWCC board's objective to achieve a high level of digital communication throughout the Idlewild community by 2020. Much of that effort is already firmly established in the board's activity throughout the year, managed by the following: Craig Sutton (webmaster—

www.IdlewildCommunity .org), Kathleen Michael (Facebook groups manager—Idlewild Friends, Idlewild Community, Idlewild Board), and Frank Ray (IWCC data management—FileMaker relational database, mailing lists, membership status, property tracking, etc.).

An experimental trial of sending IWCC email "blasts" using the Mail Chimp server is still in progress. You can sign up (opt-in) for this at www.IdlewildCommunity **.org**. However, since the Idlewild community is rapidly becoming more used to digital communication, communication via Facebook and Twitter tools may become the dominant means of keeping our population informed, largely due to their widespread use on mobile devices. Craig Sutton has reported success of the Facebook event feature in several organizations he's involved with.

For events affecting larger populations, Colfax County is managing a digital **Emergency Notification System**, described on the county's website, <u>http://</u> <u>www.co.colfax.nm.us</u>. The IWCC Board of Directors encourages everyone to enroll in ENS.

High Country Arts Festival

High Country Arts and Crafts Festival a Huge Success

The festival could not have been as successful without the wonderful participation of the volunteers from Idlewild. From setting up the park through weekend support of the vendors and visitors to tear-down and cleanup, our volunteers worked tirelessly in support of the Chamber and the festival.

The Village of Eagle Nest and its residents expressed their gratitude to all Idlewild volunteers through this letter which was read by Mayor Richard Cordova at our church service on Sunday, August 2.



Annual Meeting Minutes & In Memoriam



Minutes of the Idlewild Community Center Annual Meeting July 26, 2015

Board President Paul Fahrenthold called the meeting to order. Invocation by Theo Hauser.

Election of Board Members

Paul Fahrenthold presented the slate submitted by the Nominating Committee for four Directors for three-year terms ending in 2018. Nominated are Ben Fahrenthold, Sandra Gorohoff, Bill Hull, and Bobby Weidenmaier.

There being no nominations from the floor, a motion was made by Skip Johnson and seconded by Denny Fahrenthold to close nominations. A vote was called and the motion carried.

A motion was made by F.A. Waters and seconded by Mary Lib Thornhill to accept the slate submitted by the Nominating Committee and elect the slate by acclamation. A vote was called and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Paul Fahrenthold distributed copies of the Treasurer's Report.

A motion was made by Ron Wells and seconded by Bill Colson to accept the Treasurer's Report as submitted. A vote was called and the motion carried.

Committee Reports

Roads: Chris Herring reported that the roads have deteriorated due to high snow and rain runoff. Chris will access the roads with a road contractor and prioritize repairs.

Worship Committee: Ron Wells reported that it is best if only he or Chris Herring run the sound system. They are available to train others.

Ron Wells made a motion not to use the sound system without him or Chris Herring. The motion was seconded by Mary Colson. After discussion, the vote was called and the motion passed.

Newsletter: Kathleen Michael reported that in an effort to decrease the cost of printing and mailing the newsletter, the number of pages will decrease from 12 pages to 8, starting with the fall 2015 issue. To further decrease the cost of the newsletter the board has set a target date of fall 2020 to distribute the newsletter electronically.

Kathleen also reminded everyone that the IWCC web page is different from Facebook and encouraged all to visit both sites.

Data Management: Frank Ray is moving forward with implementation of the relational features of the Filemaker database. This will remove duplication in the tables of the database and add additional functionality in reporting.

Forest Health and Safety: Frank Ray reminded the members that IWCC is now a Firewise member. To maintain membership we must have at least one cleanup day a year. We will set up web pages on the *idlewildcommuni-ty.org* site with information regarding forest health and fire safety and with links to more in-depth information on the sites.

Maps: There are no new maps this year. The next printing for maps will be in 2017. PDFs of the current maps are available on the IWCC web page (*www.idlewildcommunity.org*).

Idlewild Community Directory: We had 172 early payers this year.

Old Business

Property Sales: There were none this year.

New Business

Helen Goodwin reported that new Worship Center signage is needed at the turn from Highway 127.

There being no additional business, a motion was made by F.A. Waters and seconded by Bill Bratton to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried.
