

Road Report

2024 Accomplishments

Drafted detailed specifications for Road Improvements, including shaping, drainage, construction procedures, and materials; Submitted competitive bid requests to seven area Contractors; Drafted Contract between Idlewild and selected Contractor; Prioritized Roads for repairs based on traffic volume and needed improvement: Roads 9 and 6

Roadwork Completed:

Road 6 (Community/Worship Center Road): 450 feet—Cost: \$18,556

Road 9 (lower sections): 895 feet—Cost: \$25,089

Dumpster Truck Turnaround (across from the Community Center) including parking area improvement and reseeding: Turnaround is

48 feet—Cost: \$8,816

Concrete pad and fencing surrounding dumpsters near the

Community Center—Cost: \$2,435.04

Trails End Ditching at Hwy. 127: no charge

Caution and Snowplow Signs installed on Roads 6 and 9

Contractor for above Roadwork: Lindsey Excavation, (505) 204-6902, Angel Fire, Cole Lindsey, Owner. Please Note: The contractor put in an additional full day of labor and heavy equipment plus materials to finish the job on Road 9 at his own expense. Notably, the contractor kept his word to Idlewild, only charging what he had bid and no more. Along with driveways, Lindsey also does earthmoving, utilities, waterlines, and septic services.





Road Report (continued)

Near-term Future Plans

Complete Road 9 improvements from Oheim to Stephenson cabins (482 feet).

Improvements to Roads 10 and Spur 9—Because these roads serve only a few cabins, the cabin owners will be asked to contribute a share of the road improvement costs. Provide annual light road repairs mostly with a bulldozer throughout the community where needed most; Maintenance on roadwork completed this year as needed.

Acknowledgments: These road improvements are your Road Fund dollars at work, and we appreciate every contribution. Thank you for yours. Please help keep our newly improved roads in good shape by keeping snow plow blades several inches above the road surface. Gouging and scrapping by snow plows can add to our maintenance costs. You may wonder why we only accomplished the work mentioned above. We ran out of money and used almost every dollar contributed over the last two years to the Road Fund.

Emergency Preparedness

For some time now we have been working on obtaining an AED for Idlewild. In the event of a cardiac 'event', utilizing an AED as quickly as possible will help save a life.

AED stands for Automated External Defibrillator. According to the Red Cross, sudden cardiac arrest is among the leading causes of death in the United States. Currently, the only way to restore a regular heart rhythm during cardiac arrest is to use an AED.

You should always contact 911 in the event of a cardiac arrest. However, because we live in such a remote area with Eagle Nest EMS the closest help, there might be a delay in receiving their assistance. That is why we (the board and I) think having an AED on the mountain would help our community help themselves while awaiting EMS.

Many of you may know about AEDs, many may not. It is a very simple piece of equipment. You apply two patches to the victim, turn on the device and it will read the cardiac rhythm and decide if a shock is needed. If so, it will say through a speaker on the device "shock needed", "give the shock, push the button".

While this explanation may seem simple, training the community on how to recognize the signs and symptoms of a heart attack, the importance of calling 911 and then learning how to use the device by 'playing with it' will be my job. As an experienced nurse and educator, I will provide training sessions. My husband Rod and I will be on the mountain starting June 19th. First, I will have to become a certified trainer and then I will start offering classes at the community center. I will have more information about dates once I firm up my training. I'll announce plans at each church service starting June 22nd and keep everyone updated.

I would like to thank the Idlewild Board and the Eagle Nest EMS for their support of this endeavor. Eagle Nest EMS is permanently loaning us an AED as we secure a second one. I look forward to meeting you and helping get everyone on the mountain ready for emergencies.
