# President's Letter

April 2017

To All Idlewilders,

Spring may have come, but the snow doesn't know winter is over. As of April 5th, Idlewild has had two snowstorms. Not light, fluffy snow, but the heavy, wet snow that makes mud. The day after the first storm the sun came out and melted most of the snow. Lots of runoff and lots of MUD. Goose reports that the roads are in pretty good shape and he'll be working throughout the spring to keep the water drainage from damaging the roads. I know you get tired of hearing this, but if you have not opted in to our email list, please go to [www.idlewildcommunity.org](http://www.idlewildcommunity.org) and click on the link to do so. There are two reasons. First, we want to be in compliance with federal laws regarding bulk email. Second, we have a goal of moving most of our communications to an electronic form by 2020. Electronic communication will save the community significant funds. See Frank Ray's update on digital communications for more details.

While you are on the [www.idlewildcommunity.org](http://www.idlewildcommunity.org) website, there is another new form to note: "Send a message to our Care-taker." This form allows you to send a message to Goose about your cabin and/or your expected dates of arrival. At the bottom of the form is a box to send a longer message if needed. Please try it out and let us have feedback on the form. We hope this form will simplify communication.

Please make a note of the Idlewild Events listed on Page 4 in this newsletter. If you are in Idlewild for any of these dates please join us. I must point out the Annual Meeting on Sunday, July 30th, at 1:00 p.m. following the potluck. Come enjoy a

feast of great food 11:30ish and then stay to elect new board members. This year we will also be voting on some revisions to the bylaws that the Board of Directors approved last year. Approval of the membership is now required. On page 5 is a detailed summary of the revisions. A complete side-by-side comparison of the current and proposed bylaws is available on the website, [www.idlewildcommunity.org](http://www.idlewildcommunity.org).

Following is a brief overview of the revisions. The first revision relates to the definition of "Active Members" and defines "Idlewild and vicinity" specifically as the J.W. Dickerson subdivision, Donel Heights subdivision, free plats in the Gallagher addition ("South of Idlewild") and free plats in the Maxwell Grant ("West of Idlewild"). The definition also includes lease owners of five years or more in the Klondyke area. "Active Members" are those who own or lease real estate in these areas and pay dues as set forth in the bylaws. This is the most substantive revision.

The start time for the Annual Meeting moves from 1:00 to 12:30 p.m. on July 30th, and the meeting place is updated to the IWCC Community Center/area. "Mail" has been defined as postal mail and electronic mail. Conference calls, video conferences, or other electronic forms of meeting have been added as acceptable meeting forums. Last, the proposed revisions make the bylaws gender neutral.

Plans are under way to keep things hopping at the Community Center. We want to revive Game Night and set up a small lending library. So if you have books you are willing to add to the collection, please bring them to Idlewild. And please let us know if you have more ideas for community activities.

# The Goose Report

## (Goose of a Feather!)

---

As you all may or may not know, you have a new caretaker who loves winters and can't wait to experience the great Idlewild community this summer.

If you haven't heard, the snow in December and January was extreme at times. Many trees came down on cabins, blocked roads, and caused downed power lines. February brought an early mud season, with the possible end to ski season (not happy) and soft soil, which caused more downed trees with extreme winds. Check out my Facebook page for photos!

After experiencing my first couple of months at Idlewild, I have some suggestions for making your winter trips more pleasant and for winterizing your cabins.

1. Clear all patio furniture and barbecue grills from decks and around the house. These items store snow and ice and are a hidden danger if I have to respond to an emergency.
2. Plan to arrive in Idlewild before dark, if possible. It's no fun to shovel a stuck vehicle after a long day on the road, in the dark, and on a hungry stomach. It makes for an unpleasant start to what should be a fun and relaxing trip.
3. Have a backup plan in case Mother Nature doesn't cooperate at all. You might not be able to get to your place due to ice, snow, downed trees, extreme mud, or other conditions that may occur. I have phone numbers to schedule snow removal services so that you won't need the phone numbers of tow trucks.
4. I highly recommend that you bring food and water for a day or two in case you are unable to stay at your cabin. This did happen to a couple of families over the holidays.
5. Notify me of your arrival plans and get an update on current conditions.

If you don't intend to visit during the winter, be sure to have opening and closing procedures on file with me or somewhere in the cabin. Turn off or unplug everything, lock every door and window, and please notify me that you will be gone until the next summer. This helps me in my job of keeping your cabin as secure as possible. Unwanted tracks are easy to spot in the snow or on wet grounds and help in monitoring your place. This winter, we did have one incident of unidentified people on premises and the sheriff was involved. The suspects were identified as possible criminals and were definitely up to no good!

So far I have had a wild and eventful winter. Nothing like jumping into the fire with both feet or, more applicable to this scenario, grabbing the chainsaw with both hands. I look forward to meeting everyone at some point in time and am here to help make sure your stay is a pleasant one.

# Proposed Revision to Bylaws

The Board of Directors has approved and recommends that the membership approve the following amendments to the IWCC bylaws. For a side-by-side comparison of the proposed revisions go to [www.idlewildcommunity.org](http://www.idlewildcommunity.org).

Article II (a)	<del>Active members shall be</del> Those persons, co-partnerships and corporations owning or leasing real estate in the community known as Idlewild <b>and vicinity</b> , near Eagle Nest, Colfax County, New Mexico who pay assessments as set forth in the bylaws become Active Members. <b><u>Idlewild and vicinity shall be defined as the J.W. Dickerson subdivision, Donel Heights Subdivision, free plats in the Gallagher Addition (S. of Idlewild), and free plats in the Maxwell Grant (W. of Idlewild).</u></b> In addition, lease owners of five years or more from the Klondyke area may become Active Members. Only Active Members may vote at stockholders' meetings or hold office as Directors of the Corporation
Article III Section 1	Annual Meeting - Amend the time to start the annual meeting from 1:00 p.m. to 12:30 p.m.
Article III Section 3	Place of Meeting - Amend the place of meeting for the Annual Meeting of members to the <b>IWCC Community Center/area.</b>
Article III Section 4	Notice of Meetings – Add electronic mail to the mode of communication
Article III Section 9	Voting by Mail – Add electronic mail to the definition of “mail.”
Article IV Section 2	Powers – correction of the type of corporation
Article IV Section 8	Special Meetings – Add conference calls, video calls or other electronic means of meetings.
Article IV Section 9	Notice – Add electronic mail and remove telegram
Article IV Section 13	Notice – Add electronic mail
Article V Section 5–8	Remove pronouns and replace with title of officer (make gender neutral)
Article VI Section 1 & 3	Remove pronouns (make gender neutral)

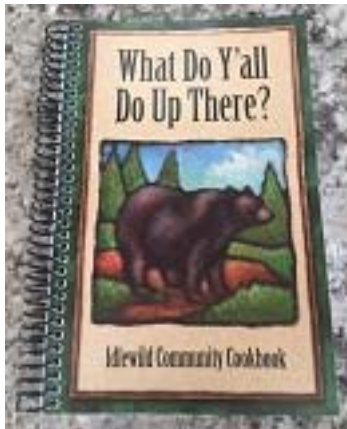
Current information customized for Idlewilders is stored in the FILES section of our private Facebook Group, **Idlewild Community, NM**. If you are a Facebook user, open your News Feed panel by clicking on “**HOME**.” Under the heading “**EXPLORE**,” you will see the heading “**Groups**.” Click on that to search for Idlewild Community, NM. When you've found it, you can join the group and it will show up in the “**SHORTCUTS**” section of your FB Home Page. It's a closed group, for Idlewild-friendly members, and there is an informal approval process by the group's owner, Kathleen Michael.

Once you are a member, information regarding Firewise in Idlewild is available by clicking on the “**Files**” button just under the Caretaker cabin photo.
