Letter from the President Hello to everyone in Greater Idlewild

Spring has arrived in the mountains. Unlike last year, plenty of snow arrived this winter, which will green up the vegetation and help to replenish the lake. All regional ski areas received over 100 inches of snow, with late snow showers highly probable. The talk in Eagle Nest is that the lake level is expected to rise 10 to 15 feet. The scenery through Cimarron Canyon should continually improve during spring and summer.

The burn ban was lifted in August of last year. Outdoor recreational fires not over 3 feet in diameter are permitted in manageable sites. Larger fires will require a permit. Please consult the Colfax County website for details.

We had a few questions raised about the Idlewild waste disposal fees. Maxi Millican made a great explanation about this in the Spring 2018 president's letter. A visit with the Village manager disclosed that Eagle Nest residents pay a \$16.00 monthly disposal fee. Yearly, this is about \$10.00 less than the Idlewild fee. It appears that the difference is not significant, but individuals are free to discuss their concerns with Village management. Eagle Nest is very intent on completely funding the trash disposal cost.

Most of you observed some of the upgrade work performed on State Highway 127. The district highway department plans to finish the road with chip-seal early this summer. They will try to communicate a time, but this work will be scheduled within the priority of other road projects.

Concerns were expressed about people driving at unsafe speeds on Highway 127. Some residents felt that chip-sealing might encourage higher rates of speed and were curious about establishing an "enforceable" speed limit within the community. Idlewild has no legislative authority and Highway 127 is a state road. New Mexico can conduct a radar survey to monitor road speed, but some guidelines will need to be discussed with District IV in Las Vegas. The board

The Goose Report

Welcome to spring! We had quite a wet winter with lots of snow. If the moisture continues, we shouldn't have the fire dangers we had last summer. However, we should still be diligent in the cleaning up of wood and slash around our properties. Below are items of interest for this summer:

• The environmental project that was developed in partnership with the Mutz Ranch is now complete. The site has brought in elk, deer, birds, and green grasses. In addition, the site helped to stop erosion that was damaging the property and became an environmental green belt.

• With the same concept in mind, we began an environmental project on Idlewild Community property last fall, hoping to achieve the same effect. There is a large erosion area down the hill from Road 12 that is affecting some of the oldest trees in Idlewild. It was used as a wood-dumping area previously, but we're trying to organize the wood and slash to create another green belt erosion control site. I need help with this much larger project and would like to have cabin owners get involved, since it directly affects Idlewild. I would like to get a work crew together in July to cut wood (bring a chainsaw if you have one), use the chipper, and organize the slash that will be put into the area. We can schedule work times as people are available. In addition, for those who help

with this environmental site, there is ample wood available that you can cut up and take to your cabin. I have the materials, you supply the labor, and it's a win-win for all.

• If your cabin doesn't have the updated fire exit and IWC policy map that was updated last summer, contact me and I'll get you one.

• During Sunday worship services, per the Fire Marshal, please use Road 6 and park in the designated parking area. Road 8 will be closed for emergency access during events at the Chapel and the Community Center.

• An updated list of contractors and service providers is on the IWC website <u>idlewildcommunity</u>. <u>org</u>. Contact the Caretaker through the link on the website or feel free to call me directly for services. I am happy to help you find someone based on your needs.

• Make sure you are connected to the IWC Facebook page for updates and information. • Once again, Game Nights will be held on Thursday evenings from Father's Day through Labor Day. Lots of games are available for children and adults. Also, after dark there will be astronomy viewings. In addition, there is a book/DVD exchange in the Community Center available for your use. Feel free to take one or share one.

• The Community Center will be open all summer for families to use. If you want to reserve it for your family event, please contact Sue Dorr or me.

Road Report

Skip Johnson, Road Committee Chair

Fortunately for the Moreno Valley, this past winter was snowy. The lake, wildlife, trees, grass, and wildflowers will all benefit from this. Of course, a great deal of snow can make getting to your cabin an experience. During the winter it is always advisable to call our Caretaker, Kevin Jarigese, to inquire about conditions in Idlewild and to inform him of your planned visit. If Kevin advises that snow conditions are severe and will most likely prevent you from reaching your cabin, please take his advice and reschedule your visit if possible.

You should have a four-wheel-drive vehicle for use in Idlewild in the winter. Even if conditions are fine when you arrive, they can deteriorate before you are ready to leave. Kevin does a great job keeping the roads as passable as he can, but sometimes travel is inadvisable even with a four-wheel-drive vehicle.

Kevin has done a yeoman's job keeping most roads open this past winter. When he uses the tractor for snow removal, two things result: a cleared road and a roadway without a crown, because with each tractor pass the roadway becomes flatter as material is pushed from the middle of the road to the edges. In the spring when snow begins to melt, it is necessary to get that melt water off the road as quickly as possible. (We've all seen what happens when water runs down the road. The result is not pretty! And the ditch produced by melt water running down a road is dangerous.) To ensure that the water gets off the road as quickly as possible, the roadway needs to be re-crowned. Kevin uses the tractor to pull roadway material back from the edges of the roadway toward the roadway center to re-crown the roadway so that water runs to the sides of the road and off it. He has now started this process as the ground begins to melt with the arrival of spring. It's a tricky process because it has to be accomplished while the roadbed is wet enough to work but not too muddy.

As of this writing, Kevin is working on all our roads where they intersect with the state highway (Idlewild Highway 127) and is draining mud holes in the roadway in preparation for the re-crowning. A location that had severe mud hole problems in previous years is Road 15 just off Highway 127, where the creek crosses Road 15. Work last year and attention at the end of the past winter has kept this spot better than it had been in many years.

For spring visits to Idlewild and during the summer following rain events, please remember not to drive through mud holes if possible, and not to repeatedly drive in the same tire tracks.

Firewise Community Activity for 2018

Progress with our Firewise effort in 2018 was remarkably successful, thanks to a large number of participants, very fine vegetation removal and advisory work by the Caretaker, and better understanding of the various parameters for the annual data reports. The Firewise report is sent to a New Mexico liaison officer via an internet portal. Many of our residents have scant knowledge of the four major data standards that Firewise USA has established for (1) proximity zones cleared of combustibles, relative to a cabin or house

on a lot; (2) quantity of vegetation units removed from each area; (3) out-of-pocket expenditures related to wildfire risk reduction; and (4) volunteer-hours of manual labor spent on the mitigation. A set of PDF pages showing the nature of the portal is being developed to explain how your efforts for the year are logged in a national unified system. We will use our email server, MailChimp, to broadcast information related to these standards. The unified standard data form allows statistical analyses in the future across the United States

that will measure the benefit of risk mitigation in the wildland-urban interface.

IWCC's Firewise management has been able, to date, to convert submitted data in all circumstances to the portal form. This is an indicator of an excellent effort for the portal design by Firewise USA. Our community has earned a new sign announcing our success in 2018. This will be delivered to the Caretaker for mounting in early summer.

MailChimp Email Server

As of March 29th, we have 279 subscribers to our MailChimp list. One hundred-forty have opted to receive the *Idle Times* by email, starting in 2020. To subscribe, open <u>www.idlewildcommunity.org</u> and click on the green button next to "Join our Mailing List." This will open a window to MailChimp, where you can enter your personal contact information. To avoid interlopers, the fields marked with an asterisk are mandatory. The email address you enter will be used by the IWCC for community messages only, and will not be shared with outsiders. Either you or a resident administrator appointed by the Board of Directors can make changes to your subscription record.

The administration would prefer that you control the data in your own record. MailChimp can be used for commercial communication such as ads, but not by the IWCC. The goal of having all residents in the community registered in MailChimp by 2020 was set by the Board of Directors several years ago.
