Letter from the President

Winter is almost over, and spring is starting to break through. I pray all our residents safely return to our mountain, ready for a great summer. Winter in Idlewild was mild with only two heavy snows and several dustings. One of our snows hit right at Christmas break causing many to get stuck and unable to get to their cabins. Idlewild has no snow removing equipment, so please make sure you are aware of the State and Idlewild road conditions prior to traveling to Idlewild. After the State plows Highway 127 there are usually large mounds of snow in front of each road. Please arrange for someone to plow your road prior to your arrival.

Notice of dues were sent out in December. If you did not receive a notice, please send me a note at dwoolsey2222@gmail.com. For the 2021-22 year, the Idlewild Board approved a separate line item of \$25 to be given to Emergency Medical Services. Our EMS is currently being handled by Angel Fire Medical Service. Eagle Nest has received a \$100,000 grant to pay the wages of two EMT personnel. This grant is renewable for two additional years and then Eagle Nest will be required to financially support the EMS program.

New updated Directories were printed in February. If you paid your dues prior to January 31, you should have received a free directory. We will have additional directories for sale at church each Sunday. In addition, you can stop by or send me a request and I will get you a directory. 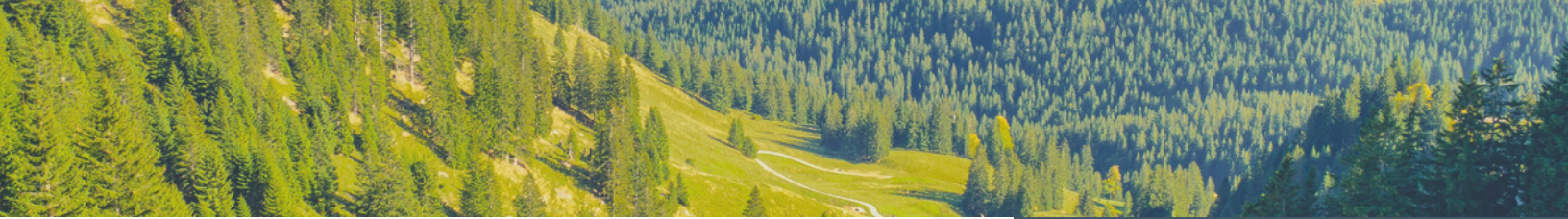

Letter from the President continued

The Moreno Valley had a major windstorm in December. Approximately 25 trees went down in our community. All affected property owners were contacted. Once the snow melts, everyone will have branches and limbs to clean up. In addition to the trees, we had several power lines pulled loose from cabins. Some cabins on Road 9 were without electricity for several days. Kit Carson will reconnect the electrical service once power lines to cabins are repaired and brought to code. Red River and Bobcat Pass were hit worse. You can't imagine how many trees are down in those areas!

As mentioned in our fall newsletter, the State of New Mexico enacted legislation regulating recreational use of cannabis. Eagle Nest's first retail cannabis store is expected to open April 1st. The building is currently under construction at the Intersection of Highway 64 and Neal Avenue, east of Highway 64 to the Village of Eagle Nest boundaries.

We lost our quest to have off-road vehicles approved in the Village limits. The new mayor, Jeff, Carr, is working on an ordinance banning them in the Village. Mr. Carr is against riding any off-road vehicle, so we'll be unable to get approval for as long as he is in office.

Thus far nobody has volunteered to take on the responsibility of keeping the Idlewild maps current from Frank Ray. The maps are essential to Idlewild. Not only do we all use them but that are extremely important for EMS and the Fire Department. I would ask again that you please consider taking over this important task. Per the Bylaws of Idlewild Community Center, the Annual Meeting will be held July 31st at 12:30 PM, following Church and Potluck.

We received a late start to winter this year. The first big snow arrived the week of Christmas and then it didn't stop. I'm estimating there was about four feet of snow accumulation over the winter.

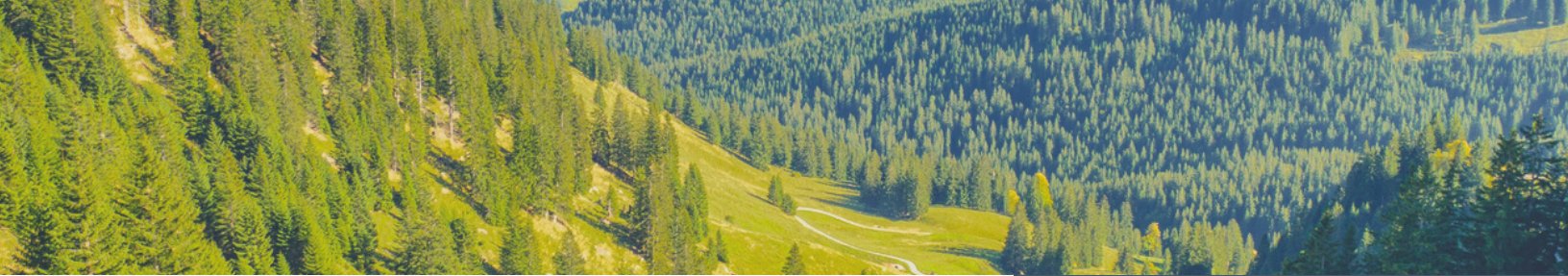

Taught evening classes Clovis Community College and Eastern New Mexico University approximately 10 years

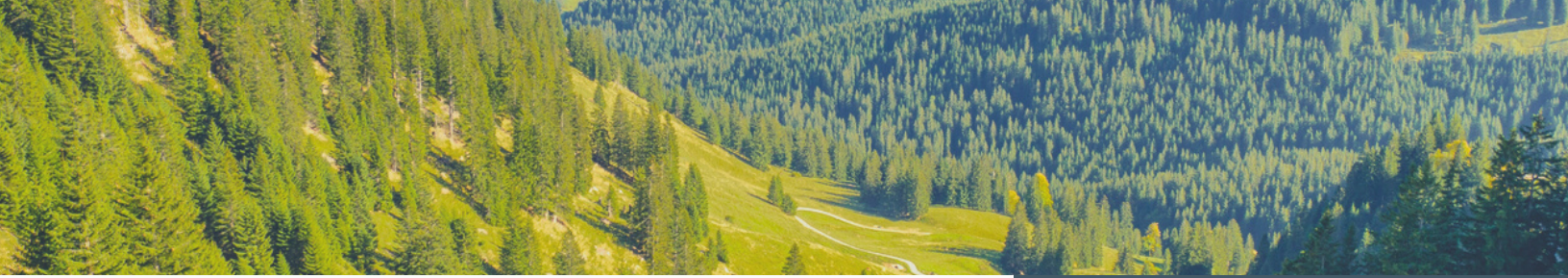

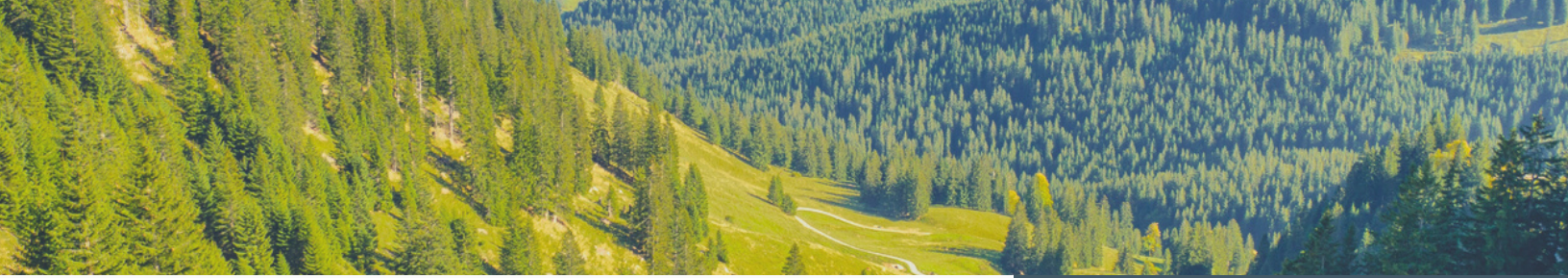
Louise Montague

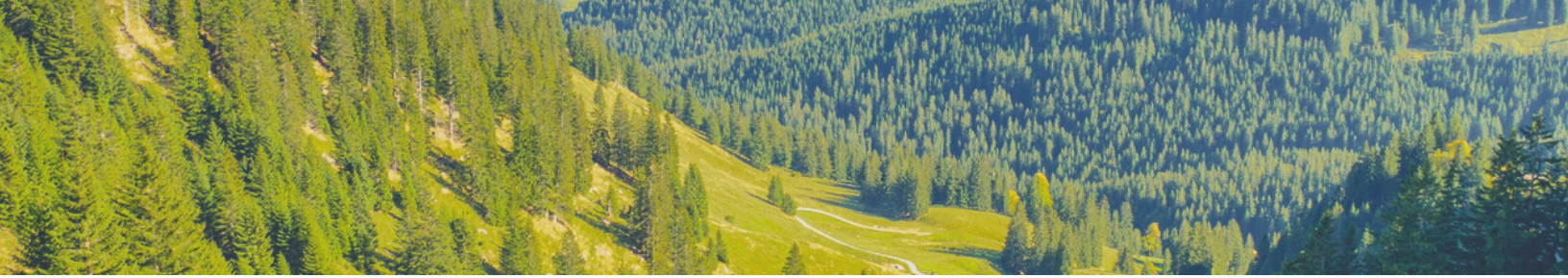

Frolic Creek Water Study!

Great news for Idlewild and our lovely Frolic Creek. On July 20, 2021, Alan Klatt and his team from the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED), Surface Water Quality Bureau took a sample from the Creek from my small bridge over the Creek at Mile Marker 3 off Hwy 127. We got results back from them on March 21, 2022 (the long delay was attributed to the lab being extremely backed up with Covid testing).

For several years, our community has speculated that the Frolic Creek was a “dead stream”. Our small native frog population in the Creek died off about 30 years ago, probably from a disease that has identified as a fungus called *Batrachochytrium dendrobatidis* (Bd), which attacks the skin of amphibians and decimated frog populations worldwide. In recent years a lack of insects in or on the Creek has raised the question as well. And there are no trout present, although 6 Mile Creek on the Taos Pueblo Ranch had a population in the past. Some answers may be the Creek might be too small, the water flow during the winter is diminished because of the ice, the Creek may have been fished out with the Gold Mine and Sawmill workers and finally the Creek flows into the Moreno Creek and on towards Eagle Nest Lake, but the Gallagher Ranch utilizes it for irrigation during the summer months and the flow is diverted. Additionally, the Moreno Creek is impaired because of high water temperatures. This is due to the lack of shade along the creek that wouldn't support fish populations. As a result, even if they could migrate, the fish are probably not in the Moreno Creek. Lots of questions, not many answers yet, but the report from the NMED is great.

Some good news! There were no metal exceedances identified from the single sampling event last summer on July 20, 2021. Everything looks like it's within the normal range.

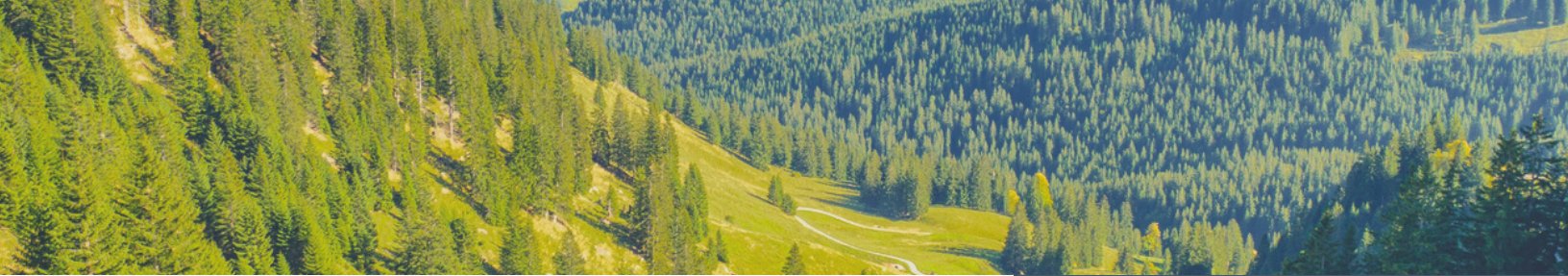
There is a caveat: a single sample is insufficient for Surface Water Quality Bureau (SWQB) to conclusively say that Frolic Creek is meeting water quality standards. To say this conclusively, SWQB strives for 8 samples during a normal water quality survey. And we would want to see all 8 samples fall within the water quality standards. The next water quality survey for the Moreno Valley won't be scheduled until 2025 (the last survey was in 2018, but Frolic Creek wasn't included then). All of New Mexico's waters are not surveyed every year, and it takes 8-10 years to survey and assess water quality across the entire state. I will recommend that Frolic Creek is included during the next survey.

New Mexico surface water quality standards are available online and are under 20.6.4 New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC, <https://www.srca.nm.gov/parts/title20/20.006.0004.html>). I'll try to explain this a little. Please call if you have questions or would like to discuss.

To start, the water quality standards are based off the "designated use". Each designated use may have a separate standard. The standard for irrigation water is generally less strict than the standard for domestic water supply. So, a stream could potentially meet the irrigation standard, but fail to meet the aquatic life standard for any particular water quality constituent.

The designated uses for Frolic Creek fall under 20.6.4.309 NMAC and include domestic water supply, irrigation, high quality coldwater aquatic life, livestock watering, wildlife habitat, and primary contact. Again, the data collected last summer indicate that the water in Frolic Creek is meeting all of the standards and supporting all of these uses.

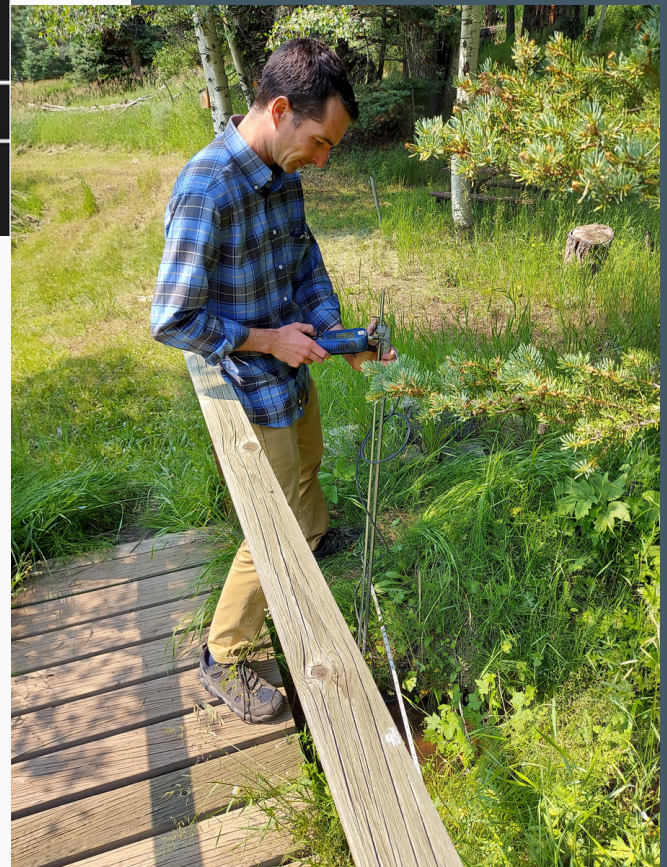
For the metals that were detected, and a few other important water quality criteria, here is a quick summary table. The measurement is the result from the sample we collected last summer. All of the detected metal measurements are within the most strict water quality standard (WQS):
