President's Letter

March 2015

To all Idlewilders:

For years our Forest Health and Safety Committee, headed by Frank Ray, has worked diligently with foresters and the fire protection community to raise our awareness of the significance of forest health and fire safety. In a separate development, Colfax County and the state have realized, after several fires ravaged the state, that the cost of fighting fires can be reduced through the participation of cabin and other property owners. The state program designed to foster that participation is called *Firewise*.

Idlewild cabin owners were early adopters of many of the Firewise-recommended activities. In 2013 an Assessment of Idlewild was conducted by Chris Romo, Arnie Friedt, and Dan Ware that focused on past efforts and needed future actions. Virtually all cabin owners have participated in raking, chipping, and cutting, as recommended in the Assessment. After the loss of the availability of the Colfax County chipper (and the loss of some momentum) we purchased a multitasking tractor and our own chipper so our required future efforts could be tailored to our community. In 2013 and 2014 we

continued our community-wide program focused by the recommendations provided by the Assessment.

In February of this year, at the suggestion of State Forestry, I submitted our application to become a Firewise Community. The application was supported by documentation indicating the community-wide participation of our property owners. In early March I received an email from Chris Romo of State Forestry stating that our application had been



approved. Our reward for this is minimal but significant. We get to post signs at the entrance to Idlewild indicating that our entire community has participated adequately in Firewise activities and has joined with the other Firewise communities in the Valley.

Chris Romo has asked that we host him and Firewise represen-

tatives at our annual meeting in July for the formal presentation of our election to Firewise. I agreed to their appearance as a significant tribute to our residents and recognition of their hard work for fire protection and forest health. I hope that many of you can attend.

Spring Break found lots of skiers in Idlewild, even though the weather produced sloppy roads and cold. I'm encouraged, nevertheless, that we may become more of a four-season destination for our residents.

Summer, with lots of twilight and cool nights, is on the way. It should be another great one!!

Gallagher Ranch has grazing rights in Idlewild. Please do not let dogs run loose or unattended. Dogs love to give chase to creatures that run (cattle included).

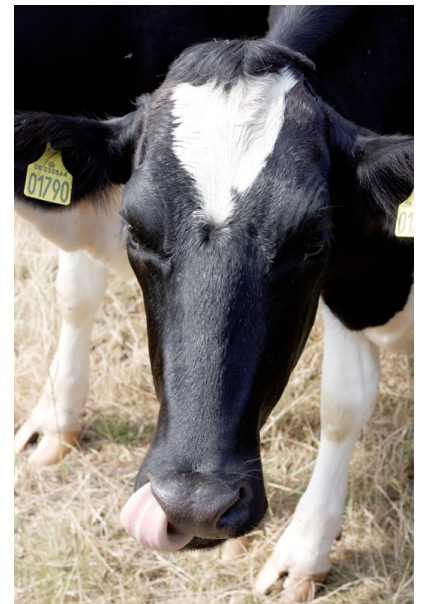

Roads in Idlewild

Greater Idlewild Roads

One of the primary, some would say the most important, IWCC board functions is our roads and their maintenance. Rain and snow can be both a blessing and a curse. Insufficient moisture leads to drought and all the unpleasant things that come with drought; however, too much moisture is harmful to dirt roads. Abundant rain and snow is, for the most part, not a problem except for dirt roads.

Our road system is generally in good shape. Many thanks are due our caretaker, Frank Dodge, and his regular road inspection program. When Frank spots a road problem he works with our Road Committee to remedy the situation. Some of the maintenance can be performed by Frank. Some requires the services of a contractor to haul and spread material in areas requiring major restoration. We are fortunate that Chris Herring, our Road Committee chair, spends much of the year in Idlewild and also regularly rides the roads looking for areas needing work.

After many community conversations about Road 9 between the Randall cabin and the Herman cabin, Frank started work to widen the road where possible and to knock down much of the hill right at the Randall cabin to improve both driver visibility and the possibility of two vehicles passing each other while traveling in opposite directions. This section of our roads is in better condition than it has ever been.

Road conditions are generally reviewed each year after the April mud season, and necessary maintenance (grading, spreading gravel, filling holes, etc.) is performed so that the roads are in good shape for the start of the summer season around Memorial Day. Depending on summer rainfall, additional maintenance may be required and is performed as necessary and as our funding allows. Our funding comes from IWCC cabin and property assessments, which also must cover our other community needs (the caretaker, community property, insurance, etc.).

For our roads there are a couple of basic items: a driving surface and a ditch. Each of us can help take care of our community roads by using some common sense when doing work around our property.

From a road maintenance standpoint, Idlewild has benefitted from the lack of moisture the past few years. The first, and most important, item in basic dirt or gravel road maintenance is to get water that tends to run down a roadway off it as soon as possible. Many of our roadside ditches carry water that falls as rain both on the road itself and on land adjacent to the road. Digging a ditch out across a field to divert water in the roadside ditch onto the empty space has two benefits. First, it gets the water off the road. Second, the water provides irrigation for grasses and wildflowers that may be growing in the field.

Some driveways cross ditches. In these cases either the ditch should remain in place with a dip in the driveway or a pipe should be used to carry the water under the driveway and back to the ditch on the lower side of the driveway. If the ditch is simply filled to provide a nice transition to the driveway without regard to where the water is going to go, BAD things happen. At the end of the ditch, the water must go somewhere, and most likely it will jump out into the road and run down the center of the road until it finds its way by gravity back into a ditch. In the past, this has led to a deep ditch in the road itself. This happens just the way, eons ago, running water from glaciers caused erosion and created deep canyons and river beds. The bottom line is that the water is going to keep running somewhere and you can help by ensuring that it does not run in the roadway.

Washboarding is a corrugation of the roadway; it is most annoying to the driver and, when it becomes severe, can lead to loss of vehicle control. It is impossible to deal effectively with this problem if the causes are not understood. Motor graders are often blamed, but in reality, they seldom cause the problem. There are three primary causes: driving habits, lack of moisture, and poor quality of gravel. Driving habits are clearly evident when washboarding is observed at intersections, going up or down steep hills, leading into or out of sharp curves and sometimes even near driveways. These are all places where drivers tend to accelerate hard or brake aggressively. This is a major cause of washboarding and one that we can address by paying attention to how we drive. We cannot control rainfall or roadway material, but we can pay attention to how we drive.

The shoulder areas and the ditches of many Idlewild roads are minimal. This is particularly true in regions with very narrow or confined space for roads. Regardless of the location, the basic shape of the road's cross section must be correct or a gravel/dirt road will not perform well even under very low traffic conditions. Each of us can really make a positive contribution to Idlewild by paying attention to roads adjacent to our properties, helping to keep water from running in the roadway, and driving appropriately in Idlewild.

The Road Committee and your Idlewild neighbors will thank you!

Cabin Address Signs

April 2015

Dear Colfax County Communities Members,

The Colfax County Coalition of Firewise Communities (CCCFC) is pleased to announce an inexpensive way of obtaining a quality 911 address sign for your home or property. We will be collecting individual orders to combine into one large order. The cost of the 6" X 18", 8 mil aluminum, double-sided, reflective vertical sign is \$19.99. There will be no tax or shipping charges. HOWEVER, if you are already a member of CCCFC, or purchase a two-year membership for \$25.00, the coalition will provide a \$12.50 rebate lowering your cost to only \$7.49!

Orders should be sent in writing by **June 30, 2015**. Please mail the form below to Audrey Roth, P. O. Box 1047, Angel Fire, NM 87710. Delivery will be made to your community representative who will disburse the signs to individuals. Thank you for participating. Orders take approximately 2 weeks to arrive. If you are not a personal member of CCCFC, then you have to join to get the discounted price. We can do another order in the fall but those may not arrive in time to receive them before many residents leave for the winter. The cut off date for that order will be October 31, 2015. Audrey must receive orders for at least 10 signs before she can send it in.

We will be ordering from SmartSign and you may check out their website at www.smartsign.com. We have verified with the Colfax County Emergency Management Department that the E911 program will NOT change anyone's address number, so your sign will still be correct after that program is fully implemented. If you have two or three digits in your address, the individual numbers will exceed the four inch minimum E911 requirement.

If interested, the Roths at 299 Palo Flechado in Taos Pines have one of these signs at the bottom of their driveway and you would be more than welcome to check out the quality in person.

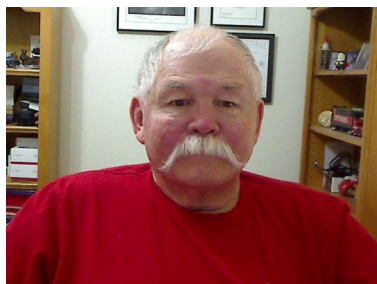

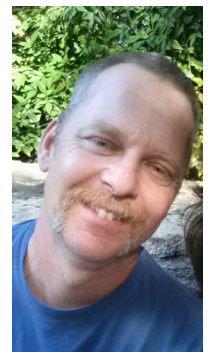
Bill Hull

Frank Ray, Chair

The IWCC database has been revised to conform to the nature of our community. There are currently 310 privately owned properties, and we are maintaining a list of 404 individual contacts associated with these properties. Many properties now have a principal representative who stands as the main point of contact with the IWCC. If your property has a group of people associated with it, and a single person is appropriate for that principal role, please let the IWCC know by contacting the data manager, Frank Ray, via email at frankray@swbell.net or by phone at 512-301-8667. This reduces several operational expenses for the IWCC throughout the year. Thanks to all who have already done this.

The IWCC continues to encourage the use of email to distribute short, timely memos to IWCC members. We are discussing more user-managed opt-in methods of maintaining a reliable file of email addresses, most likely through a prominent home page link on the IWCC website, IdlewildCommunity.org. MailChimp, the email service, reports that the list of subscribers numbers 244 as of January 15, 2015, and that 150 of the email recipients opened the email. Not bad for a start, and this will likely improve as the community gets more familiar with the practice.
